Attendance & Punctuality remains one of our top priorities in school. ### Dojo Rewards

We relaunched our ClassDojo rewards at the start of the New Year which the children have been very excited about. There are incentives for the children to earn as many points as possible over the year. Dojos are rewarded for children following our CofE 'code' (see poster below). To earn 500 dojo points in 1 year would be exemplary and so, for this achievement, for children in KS2, we plan to organise an extra 'fun' trip in the summer term for those children who make the 500-dojo mark. In EYFS and KS1, we expect more children to meet the 500-dojo mark. This is because in the early stages of school, children are praised and rewarded more frequently while we teach, and they learn our 'code'. Their reward for 500 dojos is a pizza party in school.
