### Attendance

As you know Attendance & Punctuality remains one of our top priorities in school. Regular and punctual attendance at school is both a legal requirement and essential for pupils to maximise their educational opportunities. School attendance is also an essential component of safeguarding children. We work in conjunction with St Helens' School Attendance Service who closely monitor our school attendance, with a focus on children whose attendance is causing a concern at 92% and below. As of September 2023, there have been some changes to the issue of Education Penalty Notices and school will issue an Education Penalty Notice for more than 20 sessions (10 days) in any 10-week period of consecutive unauthorised absence including an unauthorised leave of absence e.g. holiday. We want to support all of our families as much as we can, and we do recognise exceptional circumstances. If you need any support around attendance, please get in touch with the school office.

## Our School Rules

Safeguarding is one of our top priorities at Rainford C of E Primary. To support us in doing this we follow school rules to keep everyone safe when they are in and moving around school. The children know and understand our 'Code of Conduct' which I shared last month. They also know the importance of following our three school rules. The three school rules are: Be Ready, Be Responsible, Be Safe. Our current three school rules apply for when the children are in school and when they are on trips. We are currently in consultation with classes to introduce a fourth school rule. We want all stakeholders to be involved in creating our fourth school rule. Once the children have worked together in school to create their ideas, we will be in touch with parents to have your input- watch this space! Once we have our four school rules, we will make a visual with some examples of our four school rules in their categories.

There are consequences in school for not following school rules and I would like to share these with you so you can reinforce this message at home. Luckily, most children in our school follow our school rules brilliantly and consistently. Children who demonstrate good behaviour are rewarded by a whole list of rewards such as: receiving dojo points, recognition cards, star awards, hot chocolate, stickers, verbal praise, celebratory emails home, Headteacher visit, sending a child to another adult in school for additional praise, five minutes extra play, praised and celebrated during worship or assemblies.

Recently, as a staff, we have worked on our behaviour policy and clarified what consequences are given when certain behaviours are shown. We have done this because, following a pupil voice meeting, it has come to our attention that many children do not always understand what happens if they do not follow the rules, so we have made a child friendly visual explaining these consequences which will be shared in class and discussed in a PSHE lesson next week. This is the booking policy for our Breakfast and Afterschool Club:

- · Places for Wraparound Care must be booked using the School Money app
- · Allocation of places will be on a first come first served basis
- · Deadline for booking is 3.30pm on the Friday before the booking.
- · Requests for new bookings may be asked for after this deadline has passed and will be considered on a case by case basis and maybe accepted if there is capacity.
- · Deadline for cancellations is 3.30pm on the Friday before the booking. Cancellation in the week of the booking will be charged at the full rate unless cancellation is owing to child's absence from school due to illness
- · A place cannot be guaranteed because of the strict staff/children ratios school has to comply with
- · Emergency bookings will be allowed if staff/child ratios permit this
