We believe the best schools have a pupil-led culture where children take on key leadership roles to make their voices heard. The teams have met frequently to make plans and decisions about how they can, as a group, make positive change. All junior children belong to one of the seven groups that are: Eco Team, Caring Community Team; Worship Team; Sports Team; Guardian Team; Well-being Team and the Reading Team. The aim of the various teams within the Pupil Leadership Team is to enable all children to experience and develop leadership within the school, ensuring that their voices and opinions are heard. We are a pupil-led school, regularly receiving and valuing pupil voice to make improvements.

Finally, we will be running a community clear up of our forest school space on the morning of Friday 26th April, for two hours after the school drop off. If you fancy joining in, please bring along your boots and a pair of gardening gloves. We are aiming to clear the path of sticks and leaves so we can get the little path wood barked and laurel planted along the fencing. Attendance

As you know Attendance & Punctuality remains one of our top priorities in school. Regular and punctual attendance at school is both a legal requirement and essential for pupils to maximise their educational opportunities. School attendance is also an essential component of safeguarding children. We work in conjunction with St Helens' School Attendance Service who closely monitor our school attendance, with a focus on children whose attendance is causing a concern at 92% and below. As of September 2023, there have been some changes to the issue of Education Penalty Notices and school will issue an Education Penalty Notice for more than 20 sessions (10 days) in any 10-week period of consecutive unauthorised absence including an unauthorised leave of absence e.g. holiday. We want to support all of our families as much as we can, and we do recognise exceptional circumstances. If you need any support around attendance, please get in touch with the school office.


Rock Kidz!
